After the tragic loss of their beloved daughter, Danielle, Rick Lennert and Adrienne Dartnall decided to spend 3 to 4 months each year traveling to S. E. Asia to assist children and families living in poverty. For the past fourteen years they have volunteered in India, Myanmar/Burma, Cambodia, Vietnam and on the Myanmar/Thailand border, helping to create better lives for children and families. The pain and suffering they saw inspired them to make a difference in children's lives. By raising funds from friends, foundations and schools they are able to provide: clean drinking water, schools, educational supplies, medicine, clinics, as well as support local grass root organizations working tirelessly to provide health, education, training and housing for women, children and families.

In 2004 Kids International Development Society (K.I.D.S.) was formed. As a result of much hard work, a dedicated Board of Directors and a groundswell of support K.I.D.S. became a Canadian Registered Charitable Organization in 2008.

It is our belief that we must work in partnership with each community, family and organization to assess their needs from their own view point and reality. We can then provide the necessary resources, materials and support that can improve their quality of life. The work we are able to do is only possible because of the dedicated individuals we work with in these communities and the incredible generosity of our donors, board members and volunteers.

FAMILY SUPPORT

Samnang Home for Girls

K.I.D.S supports 18 resilient and wonderful girls who have either been abandoned, abused or orphaned. They live together as a happy family supporting each other under the care of You Vath, an inspiring woman, who dedicates her life to improving the lives of children. Some of the girls are now working part time and going to school. They all attend Cambodian and English school, practise their cultural dancing and learn essential life skills. It is inspiring to see how these girls have overcome such difficulties thanks to the support they have received.



Family Housing

Each year K.I.D.S supports families to improve their lives by providing them with materials to build decent livable homes for their children. The family provides the labour and K.I.D.S provides the materials. Having good shelter is very important to enhance the quality of life.



Women's Weaving Training Program

In the N.E. part of Cambodia in the Stung Treng province there is a program that K.I.D.S has supported for over eight years. Here women from poor villages learn to weave beautiful silk products that are now sold around the world. The Stung Treng Women's Development Centre trains women and enables them to make a decent living wage to support their families. K.I.D.S provides an onsite daycare/kindergarten where their children can come for free and receive a great head start to their education. While the women work their kids can play, learn and receive a good nutritious lunch. This innovative program is changing women and children's lives for the better.



HEALTH CARE AND NUTRITION

The Lake Clinic Cambodia

The Lake Clinic Cambodia brings health care to people living in remote floating villages on the Tonle Sap Lake and along the Stung Sen River. This past year K.I.D.S continued to support this life saving program by providing funds for staffing and supplies. Each week dedicated teams of health care professional and support staff head out to remote areas, where people are unable to access health care, dental care or medicine. It is a privilege to work with these outstanding individuals who put aside their own comforts to reduce suffering and improve lives.



EDUCATION

Trakiet School

In a rural area of Cambodia K.I.D.S visited a very overcrowded school where many classes had over 60 children in each classroom. Some of the students were housed in a tin shack with dirt floors that flooded in the rainy season. Together with Compassionate Eye Foundation, Canada K.I.D.S built four new classrooms for the school. We were able to provide work for local villagers for over two months, which was greatly appreciated. Now children and teachers are able to have a clean



Computers for Classrooms

Students in high school in rural Cambodia have no access to computers and yet it is one skill that will help them get employment or increase their chances to attend university or training programs as many students are not too far from an urban centre. KIDS is committed to bringing computers to schools so young people can learn and use this essential tool to better their futures. This year we provided a computer lab for Adpedai High School, now students have computer classes every day.



Education Sponsorship Program

Every year KIDS sponsors extremely poor children for an education. Most of the kids we sponsor come from families where many of the children have to work in brick factories from a young age and most never get the chance for an education. We have about 60 young people that we assist by providing them with school fees, uniforms, English lessons, bikes and school supplies so they can get an education and an opportunity to break the cycle of child labour and poverty. The families sacrifice their children's wages to support them for a better future.



School Supplies

K.I.D.S continues to provide different schools and education/training programs with much needed supplies such as bikes, desks, shoes, uniforms, books, english classes and solar lights.

CLEAN DRINKING WATER

This past year K.I.D.S was able to build three new drinking water systems for school and villagers living in rural areas of Cambodia. We are pleased to say that we have completed 10 water projects over the past few years. We now provide five thousand children and families with clean drinking water each day. Clean water makes a huge difference to the health and well being of communities and especially for students who have to travel long distances by bicycle to get to school. Clean water not only improves health it improves the ability for students to study. The schools and communities are so pleased to have these systems and it has
